Past Continuous:

- At a **specific** moment in the past.
- "On Feb 4th, sales were increasing."
- An interrupted action in the past.
- "Sales were increasing up until Covid arrived."

I have lived in Sweden since 2009. I have lived in Sweden for 13 years.

subject + have/has + past participle

I have **just** finished writing the email. - recently finished I have **already** finished writing the email. - surprising fact

Nowadays, people often work from home. Sales have increased over the last few months. Sales have been increasing over the last few months.

fall fell fallen

feel felt felt

I've tried to call you four times this week. - focus is on the result

I've been trying to call you all week! - focus on the action
