Rules for pronouncing regular verbs in the past tense that end in "-ed".

- Verbs in the base form ending in an unvoiced sound (e.g. "s", "ch", "sh") should be pronounced with a /t/ sound.
 - e.g. passed = pass't watched = watch't washed = wash't
- Verbs in the base form ending in a voiced sound (e.g. "v", "r", "z") should be pronounced with a /d/ sound.
 - e.g. loved = <mark>lov'd</mark> remembered = remember'd amazed = amaz'd
- 3. Verbs in the base form ending in "t" or "d" should be pronounced with an /id/ sound.
 - e.g. waited = waitid hated = hatid depended = depended

NB the base form can sometimes end in a silent "e" (e.g. hat**e**) but this is not important.
